City of South Bay City Workshop February 07, 2017

A City Workshop of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida was called to order by Mayor Joe Kyles in the Commission Chambers at 335 S.W. 2nd Avenue, South Bay, Florida on February 07, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of the regular agenda items. He mentioned the certificates of recognition for the Oratorical winning contestants under proclamations. He thanked Commissioner Berry and Commissioner McKelvin for being involved with the Oratorical contest.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of 5a. approval of city minutes for January 03rd and 17th 2017. Commissioner Berry had an observation on page 3385, adding "Berry" after Commissioner, in the second paragraph. The City Clerk stated that she would make the correction to the January 17, 2017 city minutes.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of Resolution 68-2017.

The City Clerk read Resolution 68-2017 for the record.

A resolution of the city commission of the City of South Bay, Florida, authorizing the Mayor and City Manager to execute an agreement for emergency information technology services with Coastal Network Solutions, LLC for technical support of the City's computer network; providing an effective date

The City Manager stated that the city's informational system was looking forward with moving with the purchase of \$1,500 with Coastal Network Solutions and stated that the "they" are currently providing for the City of Pahokee's IT services. He said that the city had external influences with the city's system within the City.

Vice-Mayor Wilson asked "who would monitor the technology services". The City Manager said that there would be someone "in house" working with our systems now, however it would be the information technology working within itself. Vice-Mayor Wilson asked if there were three bids for this service. The City Manager said that the company was currently working with the City of Pahokee and said that staff did not go out for the three bids. He said that there was situation that was going on with the city's technology system and requested to move forward with an emergency purchase. The City Manager clarified that the \$1,500.00

per month and the \$90.00 per hour was for anything that was not in the scope of work. The City Attorney requested to offer a supplement to Article 4.1 (per month) behind "managed IT services".

Commissioner Berry stated that she had a reservation on approving due to the item not being placed out to bid. The City Manager stated that the city was protected under a procurement policy for emergency purchases.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of Resolution 69-2017.

The City Clerk read Resolution 69-2017 for the record.

A resolution of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida, authorizing the sale of a parcel of cityowned land, as more specifically described in exhibit "A" attached hereto, to Palm Beach County Housing Authority, for the amount of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00); authorizing the city manager and the Mayor to execute all necessary documents, including the purchase and sale agreement set forth in exhibit "B"; authorizing the City Clerk to record and transmit all documents necessary for the sale of the property; Providing for an effective date.

The City Manager stated that the commission requested that staff seek an appraisal of 845 Palm Beach Road for fair market value and the price came back at \$250,000.00. He said that the Commission also instructed staff to create a purchase/sale agreement with Palm Beach County Housing Authority. He stated that staff was requesting approval of Resolution 69-2017.

Larry Greenberg, Vice-President of Development with Palm Beach County Housing Authority made a comment on the new South Bay Villas. He also introduced Joe Glucksman, President of McCurdy Senior Housing. Mr. Greenberg stated that Palm Beach County Housing Authority had teamed up with McCurdy group. He said that the development that was being built had been keeping up with everything that was being proposed for the last years. He said that the redevelopment of the south bay villas property was in conjunction with the redevelopment of Marshall Heights. He said that 845 Palm Beach Road was to be the main hub of that community and the management office. He said that there will be a separate entrance for the fortin center (daycare).

Mr. Glucksman stated that the site plan approval had went through this past year and stated that the offset for preliminary closing was scheduled for February 28, 2017 and final closing scheduled for March 02, 2017. He said that "they" are scheduled to be heard before the Palm Beach County Housing Finance Authority on Friday, February 10, 2017. Mr. Glucksman said that all of their efforts had been sanctioned by the HUD office and had gained approval for their demo disposition application. Mr. Glucksman also stated that their subsidy laying review passed with flying colors, which allows vouchers that would go into helping support residents of the subdivision living area.

Commissioner McKelvin asked a question in reference to the old community center. He asked if the building was to be torn down or remodeled. Mr. Glucksman stated that they would strip it down and remodeling the

Commissioner McKelvin asked "what is the square footage of the building". The City Manager responded that the building was exactly 4,440 square feet. The City Manager also clarified that "they" were also purchasing the property as is, at market value.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of Resolution 70-2017. The City Clerk read Resolution 70-2017 for the record, a Resolution of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida, approving an extension to the external audit services agreement with HCT Certified Public Accountants and Consultants, LLC (HCT) until September 30, 2018; providing and effective date.

The City Manager recommended that the City Commission exercise an extension provision set forth relating to the contract with HCT certified public accountants and consultants, LLC.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of Resolution 71-2017. The City Clerk read Resolution 71-2017 for the record, a resolution of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida, authorizing the City Manager to execute the attached work order proposal from C.A.P. Engineering, Inc. D/B/A Cap Engineering, pertaining to NW 1st Street from 3rd Avenue to 1st Avenue rehabilitation project as a continuing agreement; providing for an effective date.

A City Workshop of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida was called to order by Mayor Joe Kyles in the Commission Chambers at 335 S.W. 2nd Avenue, South Bay, Florida on February 21, 2017 at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of the request made by the City Clerk in reference to an assistant needed. He stated that it was requested by Commission Scott that the City Manager compile the back-up information needed for the request.

The City Manager stated that at the last commission meeting, the City Clerk requested to create an administrative assistant position. He stated that a memo went out to the City Clerk requesting a job description, identifying whether the position was exempt or non-exempt, the justification for that position, how the position would benefit the city, identifying any inefficiencies and how this position would improve in those areas that need addressing, determine cost saving measures that would allow for a increase level of service and how it will improve overall efficiency. He stated that the City Clerk presented some information to the Manager's office along with a resolution. He said that the position was requiring an increase in the City Clerk's budget of \$17,060 and said "we were unable to identify any additional revenue to cover "that" expense as well as line items for essential services to decrease for that position".

Commissioner McKelvin requested additional information on why the City Clerk was proposing for additional help. The City Clerk mentioned the memo in the packet distributed to the Commission, relating to the justification for additional personnel. She stated that the Commission established a beautification committee and youth council just recently and her primary goal for the youth council would be to spend as much time with the new council in order to get the youth council off the ground. She stated that in order to build and keep the council as her main focus at this time she would need assistance within the Clerk's department.

Commissioner Berry asked if the statement by the City Manager, relating to the item not being in the budget for 2016-2017, was correct. The City Manager stated "that was correct". Commissioner Berry mentioned the "general description of class" and asked "what was the process of amending the budget to include additional

personnel". She clarified that the City Clerk's position was in the charter and that position and duties were specified. She said that it appeared that the City Clerk wanted to include other items in her responsibilities. She asked if the present duties would not allow her to do her responsibilities without additional help. The City Clerk said that it was possible, however this year she needed help, relating to her responsibilities and for other personnel health reasons, and that she is overwhelmed. She said that she would like additional time to review the additional duties as presented. She also stated that she was concerned about adding the item as "an amended budget item". She said that this may be a time to assess the budget, due to the statement earlier relating to not being able to make the budget adjustment. She asked if there were any adjustment in the budget relating to personnel. She stated that she would like to review the budget to see how the commission could support the staff's request. She also asked for any adjustments relating to salaries to be included in the budget discussion, moving forward. She requested to put the item on the next agenda for discussion.

The City Manager stated that he did support the statements from Commissioner Berry. He said that he was looking into putting out an RFQ for an effective and efficiency study to take place within the City of South Bay and not only looking at one department but looking at the entire departments in the City as a whole. He said there may be needing assistance in additional departments. He said that he would like to present to the commission, that the city is "right sizing" the city moving forward.

Commissioner Berry said that she would like to address "this item" first, relating to the clerk's request and consider the RFQ, if feasible, to have the study done during the next budget discussion.

Vice-Mayor Wilson said that the City Clerk was, Mrs. Walker's assistant for many years and at that time there was not as much going on in the city as there is now. He recommended allowing the Clerk to have an assistant, due to her being over worked.

Mayor Kyles recommended bringing back the item at the next meeting, due to the additional information needed from the City Manager, to make sure that the City can move "this position" into a budget item.

The City Clerk stated that the statement "there was no revenue within the budget" made by the City Manager. She asked "then what exactly would need to come back, shouldn't that have been brought up at this time". Mayor Kyles stated that "at this time" the information was requested again by Commission Berry from the City Manager and the Finance Director.

The City Manager clarified that there was no additional revenue recognized in order to fund the line item for the clerk.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BAY, FLORIDA, IMPOSING MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE OF NEW APPLICATIONS AND ON THE ISSUANCE OF CITY **PERMITS** OR **APPROVALS FOR** PENDING APPLICATIONS, FOR THE INSTALLATION OF ABOVE-"WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES" WITHIN ANY CITY RIGHTS-OF WAY OR WITHIN ANY EASEMENTS ADJACENT TO **RIGHTS-OF-WAY: PROVIDING** THAT MORATORIUM SHALL BE IN EFFECT UNTIL JULY 31, 2017, UNLESS OTHERWISE MODIFIED OR EXTENDED BY THE CITY COMMISSION; FURTHER DIRECTING CITY STAFF TO UNDERTAKE A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW **OF** THE CITY'S **EXISTING** COMMUNICATIONS **FACILITIES** REGISTRATION. PERMITTING AND INSTALLATION CODES WITH AN EMPHASIS ON ENSURING THE PROTECTION OF VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC WITHIN AND ALONG CITY RIGHTS-OF-WAY, ENSURING THE PROTECTION OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES ALONG CITY RIGHTS-OF-WAY, AND COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE REQUIREMENTS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT OF 1996, AND SECS. 337.401 AND 365.172, FLORIDA STATUTES; **PROVIDING** FOR CONTINUATION, **EXTENSION** OR **TERMINATION OF SAID** MORATORIUM; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE AND A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the telecommunications industry is regulated by both federal and state laws, which said laws provide for the adoption of reasonable local rules that allow local governments to regulate the placement of wireless communications facilities and

other communications facilities within rights-of-way and on other property within their jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the City has recently received applications and requests for the placement of above-ground wireless communications facilities within City rights-of-way or in easements adjacent to City rights-of-way, including rights-of-way in residential districts; and

WHEREAS, the City's Code of Ordinances contains certain sections and provisions which, as written, apply to such applications; but which, upon review, were not written with the current state of the art or technological advances in telecommunications in mind; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of South Bay has been made aware of the above referenced applications and requests.

WHEREAS, further, the City Commission has been made aware of factual data indicating the proliferation of similar wireless communications facilities in other jurisdictions, as well as the health, safety and welfare implications and concerns associated therewith, including but not limited to, the diminishment of residential property values and a decline in the aesthetics and character of the City's rights-of-way and the City's residential districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission believes that a five (5) month moratorium on the acceptance of new applications and on the issuance of City permits or approvals for pending applications for the installation of above-ground wireless communications facilities within any City rights-of-way or within any easements adjacent to City rightsof-way as more fully set forth herein is necessary in order to maintain the status quo in the City and simultaneously allow City Staff time to conduct a comprehensive review of the City's existing codes to determine their compliance with federal and state laws, to determine what revisions are required in order to best protect the residents, property and rights-of-way of the City as permitted by law, and to ensure that City Code provides for a thorough and efficient application process for applicants; and

WHEREAS, the City of South Bay has held all required public hearings and has provided public notice in accordance with applicable State statutes and City ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of South Bay has determined that the enactment of this moratorium is in the best interest of the City and is necessary in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BAY, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Adoption of Representations.

The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a specific part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Findings.

The recitals set forth in the "Whereas" clauses above are true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings by the City Commission for the adoption of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Definitions.

For purposes of this temporary moratorium, the following definitions apply as these terms are used in this Ordinance:

Section 4. Temporary Moratorium.

There is hereby imposed a moratorium with respect to the acceptance of new applications, and the issuance of City permits or approvals for pending applications, for the installation of above-ground "wireless communications facilities" within any City rights-of-way or within any easements adjacent to City rights-of-way. For purposes of this ordinance, the term "wireless communications facility" means any equipment or facility used to provide wireless communications service and may include, but is not limited to, antennae, towers, equipment enclosures, cabling, antenna brackets, and other such equipment. Placing a wireless communications facility on an existing tower or building does not cause the existing tower or building to become a wireless communications facility.

During the term of the moratorium, City Staff shall conduct a comprehensive review of the City's existing communications facilities registration, permitting and installation codes, to ensure compliance with federal and state laws including but not limited to the Telecommunications Act of 1996, and Sections 337.401 and 365.172, Florida Statutes, to ensure the safety of vehicular and pedestrian traffic within and along City rights-of-way, to ensure the protection of City residents that live along City rights-of-way from adverse impacts associated with the installation of above-ground

wireless communications facilities, and to ensure that City Code provides for a thorough and efficient application process for applicants.

During the term of the moratorium, it shall be unlawful for any person or entity to install new above-ground wireless communications facilities within any City rights-of-way or within any easements adjacent to City rights-of-way. Nothing contained in this ordinance shall be construed to apply to communications facilities other than above-ground wireless communications facilities as defined herein, to prevent or prohibit the acceptance and processing of applications, or the issuance of permits for the maintenance, repair or removal of any wireless communications facility installed and existing prior to the adoption of this ordinance, or to prevent or prohibit the expansion of existing wire line communications facilities that do not provide wireless communications services.

This moratorium shall remain in full force and effect until 5:00 p.m. on July 31, 2017. This moratorium shall automatically expire at said time unless terminated sooner by the City Commission at a public hearing called for such purpose. The City Commission may, by ordinance, and upon the adoption of findings of fact justifying same, extend the term of this moratorium beyond its automatic expiration date.

Violations of this moratorium may be remedied through any means available to the City, both in law and at equity.

Section 6. Conflict & Repealer.

All ordinances, parts of ordinances or code provisions in conflict herewith ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Severability.

If any section, sentence, clause or any other provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or be found unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not be construed so as to render invalid or unconstitutional the remaining sections, sentences, provisions or clauses of this Ordinance.

Section 8. Inclusion In Code.

It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of West Park that the provisions of this Ordinance shall at some time in the future become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of West Park and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Chapter," "Section," "Article" or such other appropriate word or phrase, the use of which shall accomplish the intentions herein expressed; provided, however, that Section 1 hereof or the provisions contemplated thereby shall not be codified.

Section 9. Effective Date:

This Ordinance shall become effective as provided by law.
