### RULES OF PROCEDURE

### WHO MAY SPEAK

Meetings of the City Commission are open to the public. They are not; however, public forums. Any resident who wishes to address the commission on any subject within the scope of the Commission's authority may do so, providing it is accomplished in an orderly manner and in accordance with the procedures outlined below.

### **SPEAKING ON AGENDA ITEM**

- Consent Agenda Item These are items, which the Commission does not need to discuss individually, and which are voted on as a group. Any Commissioner who wishes to discuss any individual item on the consent agenda may request the Mayor to pull such item from the consent agenda. Those items pulled will be discussed and voted upon individually.
- Regular Agenda Items These are items, which the Commission will discuss individually in the order listed on the agenda. By majority vote, the City Commission may permit any person to be heard on an item at a non-public hearing.
- **Public Hearing Items** This portion of the agenda is to obtain input from the public on some ordinances, resolutions and zoning applications. The chair will permit any person to be heard on the item during formal public hearings.

### SPEAKING ON SUBJECTS NOT ON THE AGENDA

Any resident may address the Commission on any items pertaining to City business during the Opportunity For The Public To Address the Commission portion of the agenda. Persons wishing to speak must sign in with the City Clerk before the start of the meeting.

### ADDRESSING THE COMMISSION, MANNER AND TIME

By majority vote the City Commission may invite citizen discussion on any agenda item. In every case where a citizen is recognized by the Mayor to discuss an agenda item, the citizen shall step to the podium/microphone, state his or her name and address for the benefit of the city clerk, identify any group or organization he or she represents and shall then succinctly state his or her position regarding the item before the city commission. Any question, shall be related to the business of the City and deemed appropriate by the Mayor, shall be directed to the Mayor and the Mayor shall then re-direct the question to the appropriate Commissioner or City Staff to answer the citizen question which shall be related to the business of the City.

All comments or questions of the public are to be directed to the Mayor as presiding officer only. There shall be no cross conversations or questions of any other persons. The length of time each individual may speak should be limited in the interest or order and conduct of the business at

hand. Comments to the Commission by individual citizens shall be limited to three (3) minutes during the citizens request period. The City clerk shall be charged with the responsibility of notifying each citizen thirty (30) seconds before said time shall elapse and when said time limit has expired.

### **APPEALS**

If a person decides to appeal any decision made by the board, agency, or commission with respect to any matter considered at such hearing, he or she will need a record of the proceedings, and that, for such purpose, he or she may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

### **DECORUM**

If a member of the audience becomes unruly, the Mayor has the right to require the person to leave the room. If a crowd becomes unruly, the Mayor may recess or adjourn the meeting. Please silence all cell phones and pagers.

City of South Bay City Workshop August 15, 2017

A City Workshop of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida was called to order by Mayor Joe Kyles in the Commission Chambers at 335 S.W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, South Bay, Florida on August 15, 2017 at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Kyles mentioned discussion of the tentative budget FY 2017-2018.

The City Manager mentioned the following highlighted sections of the FY 2017-2018 proposed budget: (full discussion/recording/presentation documents available through the City Clerk's Office)

- Legislative
- Planning & Zoning
- Non-Department
- Community Development
- Parks & Recreational

The City Clerk read Resolution 97-2017 for the record, for discussion only.

Resolution 97-2017, a resolution of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, Florida authorizing the City Manager to execute a state funded grant agreement between the City of South Bay and State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management to fund an emergency shelter and care center within the city limits; providing for an effective date.

The City Manager said that the scope of work, relating to the resolution, was to include architectural and engineering services fees, site survey, soil testing, repertory reviewing of permit fees, demolition and restoration construction and civil work, tree and landscape hazard removal, installation of stand by electrical system and management of the administration of the ground. He said that "this" item was to harden the Tanner Park Facility relating to the designing of an emergency care and community center.

The City Clerk read Ordinance 08-2017 for the record, for discussion only.

An Ordinance of the City Commission of the City of South Bay, adopting new floodplain management regulations; to adopt new flood hazard maps, to designate a floodplain administrator, to adopt procedures and criteria for development in flood hazard areas, to adopt technical amendments to the Florida building code and for other purposes; providing for adoption of representations; providing for applicability; providing for conflict and repealer; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in code; providing for an effective date.

The City Manager said that staff was recommending approval of second reading on Ordinance 08-2017 in order for the city to continue through the national flood insurance program. He mentioned that the item was discussed during a workshop and conference call.

### **City Manager Report**

The City Manager said, in reference to the news, the new South Bay Villas was progressing well and there were no issues relating to the project. He also said that Waste Management along with others came out to meet the Mayor and made a donation of backpacks.

He also mentioned that the City of South Bay had been awarded \$1.3 million dollars to construct SW  $10^{th}$  (South End) to MLK. He said that there was an agreement that was going to come back before the commission.

Mayor Kyles called for voting conflicts. There were none.

### Resolution

### **ORDINANCE NO. 10-2017**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BAY, FLORIDA, AMENDING APPENDIX A, "ZONING," OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES TO BAN MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTER DISPENSING FACILITIES AMENDING ARTICLE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS; "DEFINITIONS", BY AMENDING SECTION 4.1- ESTABLISHED; XXI,"SUPPLEMENTAL **REGULATIONS** ARTICLE APPLYING TO SPECIFIC, TO SEVERAL OR ALL DISTRICTS" DIVISION 1, BY ADOPTING A NEW "SECTION 21.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS, ITEM 12., MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTER DISPENSING FACILITIES" PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT AND REPEALER: PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in November 2016, the State of Florida, by constitutional amendment, legalized the use of marijuana for debilitating medical conditions as determined by a licensed Florida physician and as regulated by the Department of Health; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2017, the Governor signed Florida Senate Bill 8A, relating to the medical use of marijuana, into law; and

WHEREAS, Section 381.986(11), Florida Statutes, provides that the regulation of the cultivation, processing, and delivery of marijuana by medical marijuana treatment centers is preempted to the state except as otherwise provided therein; and

WHEREAS, Section 381.986(11)(b)1, Florida Statutes, provides that a municipality may, by ordinance, either ban medical marijuana treatment center

dispensing facilities from being located within the boundaries of that municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission wishes to ban medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities within the City as authorized by general law; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that adoption of this Ordinance is in the best interests of the general welfare of the City of South Bay.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSON OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BAY, FLORIDA AS FOLLOWS:

### Section 1. Adoption of Representations.

The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified as true and confirmed and are incorporated herein.

Section 2. Article IV of Appendix A; Section 4.1 of the City of South Bay Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

### **ARTICLE IV. - DEFINITIONS**

### Sec. 4.1 - Established.

For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms and words are hereby defined. Words used in the present tense shall include the future; the singular number shall include the plural; and the plural the singular; the term "used for" shall include the meaning "designed for"; the term "structure" shall include the term "building"; the term "lot" shall include the terms "plot" and "tract"; the word "shall" is mandatory and not directory.

Medical marijuana treatment center means an entity that acquires,

cultivates, possesses, processes (including development of related products such as food, tinctures, aerosols, oils or ointments), transfers, transports, sells, distributes, dispenses or administers marijuana, products containing marijuana, related supplies, or educational materials to qualifying patients and their caregivers and is registered by the State Department of Health.

Medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facility means a facility that is owned or operated by, or affiliated with, a medical marijuana treatment center holding all necessary licenses and permits from which medical marijuana is delivered, purchased, possessed or dispensed for medical purposes.

Section 3. Article XXI of Appendix A; Section 21.1, item 12 of the City of South Bay

Code Of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

## ARTICLE XXI - SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS APPLYING TO SPECIFIC, TO SEVERAL OR ALL DISTRICTS

Sec. 21.1.12. Medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities

Medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities are prohibited within the City's corporate limits.

### Section 4. Conflict and Repealer.

Any and all ordinances and regulations in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

### **Section 5.** Inclusion into the Code of Ordinances.

It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of South Bay's Code of Ordinances, and that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance"

may be changed to "section," "article," "regulation," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

### Section 6. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared.

### Section 7. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and adoption.
